ACCESS AND DISABILITY PROMOTED IN REGION

Advocacy group members from Speak Up Alexandra Jamie Watkins and Luke Taylor at the inaugural Strathbogie Access and Disability Committee Meet and Mingle networking event in Nagambie.

The access and disability sector is growing in not only the Strathbogie Shire but north eastern Victoria following the first networking event of its kind in the region.

About 35 people from advisory committees and advocacy groups across the Goulburn region (incorporating Moira, Shepparton, Mitchell and Murrindindi Shires) attended the inaugural Meet and Mingle event at Mitchelton Wines recently.

It was the first time an event like this has been facilitated in the Strathbogie Shire region.

Feedback was unanimous, with some saying they were impressed with the enthusiasm and commitment of the Strathbogie Access and Disability Advisory Committee (ADAC) members.

"It was a very well run event with some technicalities overcome," they said.

When asked why advocacy groups are so important, an attendee replied "so they could be heard".

Strathbogie's ADAC promotes consultation and ensures participation mechanisms are in place for people with a disability, as well as their carers, advocates and service providers.

It also supports and raises community awareness of the rights of people with a disability.

The ADAC will ensure that members of the committee reflect the diversity within the Strathbogie Shire community including ethnicity, age, gender and location.

The committee meets every four to six weeks and is actively looking for new residents to join.

The completion of the extensive renovation at the Violet Town Community House by Strathbogie Council's building and maintenance team has transformed this comfy area from an old bakery to a bright and inviting space.

Council's building and maintenance team removed all white ant damaged wall framing and plasterboard, and replaced it with treated pine timber studs, complete with new plasterboard and a fresh coat of paint. All works were completed within the allocated time frame of four weeks.

In 2017, the Community House will be offering a range of new programs including community gardening, arts and will continue to host the Mother Goose activities for the little ones and deliver the food share service.

The house continues to be a drop-in centre for information and support and is always looking for volunteers to be on the Committee of Management, to help with the monthly pizza oven at the Violet Town Market and other activities.

COUNCIL CONSULTS WITH NAGAMBIE COMMUNITY ON MAIN ST

Over 100 residents turned out to Strathbogie Shire's 'listening post' for the next stage of the Nagambie main street development.

Residents of Nagambie and surrounds braved the cold conditions to look at the proposed plans for High Street, which include the introduction of angle parking and a purpose-built visitor information centre.

About 60 people packed the median strip of Nagambie's High Street on Wednesday, September 21 while 50 residents took their concerns and feedback to Harry's Café at a second listening post later that night.

Council officers were on hand to provide all the information on the proposal and received plenty of hands-on, constructive feedback that will allow them to move forward with a revised design concept.

WATER SECURED IN SHIRE

Long term strategies for securing water for Strathbogie Shire was the focus of the recent Sustainable Development Reference Group (SDRG) meeting.

The SDRG (comprising of community members from across the Shire and Council staff), invited John Xu from Goulburn Valley Region Water Corporation to present to the group and inform them on the future strategies Goulburn Valley Water have in place for our region.

Recognising that Euroa and Violet Town's current long term water supply outlook sits in the risk category, with supply and restrictions reviewed on a weekly basis, a new 300ML storage dam will be constructed next to Abbinga Reservoir in 2019-2020.

Once commissioned, it will enable repair works to be carried out on Abbinga as well as increase Abbinga's current capacity to 700ML and following these works, it is also proposed to upgrade the Gooram pipeline by 2021-22.

The group looks forward to seeing these works implemented and thanks GVW for taking the time to inform the group on their strategies for the region.


