CONDUCT OF PUBLIC

- 52. VISITORS
 - (1) Visitors must not interject or take part in debate.
 - (2) Silence shall be preserved in the gallery at all times.
 - (3) If any visitor is called to order by the Chairperson and again acts in breach of this Local Law, the Chairperson may order that person to be removed from the gallery.

53. CALL TO ORDER

Any person who has been called to order, including any Councillor who fails to comply with the Chairperson's direction, will be guilty of an offence.

Penalty: \$500

54. REMOVAL FOR DISRUPTION

The Chairperson has discretion to cause the removal of any person, including a Councillor, who disrupts any meeting or fails to comply with a direction under the provisions of this Local Law.

A draft new 21 year lease has been prepared, by agreement with the current tenant.

RECOMMENDATION

- 1. That Council resolve to proceed with the proposal to reissue the new lease to the current tenant.
- 2. That Council authorise the giving of public notice of the intention to reissue a lease of the Euroa Caravan and Tourist Park (which extends the expiry date from 2018 to 2033) to Morgan Caravan Parks P/L at independent valuation.
- 3. The Council invite submissions under Section 223 of the Local Government Act 1989, to be heard by Council at a Special Council Meeting to be held at 5.00pm Tuesday 13th November 2012.
- 4. That if no submissions are received, and conditional on the approval of Department of Sustainability and Environment (DSE), Council proceed with issue of the new lease.
