Strathbogie Shire celebrates Australia Day 2018

Thirty-six Strathbogie Shire residents, community groups and events were recognised and awarded at the 2018 Australia Day Awards Ceremonies.

Ceremonies were held in the townships of Avenel, Euroa, Longwood, Nagambie, Strathbogie and Violet Town.

Australia Day Awards recognise and commend the community service contributions and achievements of local people during the previous year.

The following nominees were selected as the 2018 Shire-wide award winners:

Community Organisation of the Year- Euroa Third Age Club

The Third Age Club have provided many years of exemplary service to the mature citizens of Euroa including outings, meals, dancing, coffees and special occasions. They played an integral role in the Australian National Show & Shine, hosting the VIPs, judging staff, Police and Ambulance staff for the day.

Community Event of the Year- Euroa Labour Day Tennis Tournament

The Euroa Lawn Tennis Club hosted a huge three day tournament over the Labour Day weekend with a record 530 players registered for events. Seven additional courts were constructed on the adjacent Friendlies Oval to cater for extra matches in singles and doubles. Despite a drizzle of rain on the Saturday event, it was hugely successful, with all matches completed and prizes presented.

Junior Citizen of the Year- Imogen Kelly

Imogen constantly supports the Violet Town Football Netball Club by offering her service during the season to play and to support game days, assisting with the many fundraising functions, and won the Junior Club Person in 2017. She volunteered to help out at VicSwim last year, as well as assisting with the Nightmare on Cowslip Street celebrations and Community House activities.

Young Citizen of the Year- Amelia Morris

Amelia is a very impressive young leader. She was the Euroa Secondary College School Captain in 2016 and was an active member of schools Student Representative Council in 2017. Last year, Amelia became a member of the Orygen Youth Advisory Council, the National Centre of Excellence for Youth Mental Health. She also started a Mental Health Awareness Group in the local community, and ran monthly meetings at the Euroa Library. Amelia was selected as a representative on the Victorian Government's Youth Congress in October 2017.

Citizen of the Year (joint winner): Trevor Northey

Trevor has volunteered at the Violet Town Market from 5.00am in the morning for many years. He is the friendly face of the market for the stallholders, as he is the one that greets them from early setup - rain, hail, frost or shine! He takes a lot of responsibility for the jobs that need doing and is one key reason the market is such a success. A carpenter by trade, Trevor uses his skills to fix what needs to be fixed in the community, volunteering his time to many local groups and facilities including Violet Town Community House and Euroa Arboretum.

Citizen of the Year (joint winner): Fiona Smith

Fiona is a very active member of the Nagambie community. She has been on North East Breeders Committee for 15 years and was awarded the North East Breeders Industry Award in 2009. Fiona was the treasurer of the Nagambie Cricket Club from 2003-2007 and a committee member of St Joseph's Parents and Friends for seven years. She currently volunteers as the Treasurer of Tabilk Junior Football Club and is a member of the Nagambie Recreation Reserve Committee, Nagambie Football Club Committee and Nagambie Bowls Club Committee.
