A \$20,000 grant program has been awarded to 11 groups in the Strathbogie Shire to further enhance community development.

The AusNet Services Energising Your Community development program has awarded grants of up to \$3000 to local, not-for-profit organisations for eligible projects.

Back in August this year, AusNet and Council put the call out for local sporting/recreation clubs, service organisations and support groups to apply with their best sustainable projects for the betterment of their clubs and to the benefit of community members.

Council and AusNet representatives attended a special ceremony at the Avenel Bowling Club recently where the grants were awarded to the community groups.

Mayor Amanda McClaren said these groups were all run by volunteers and Council was appreciative of the time spent on these projects.

"These grants will enable not for profit organisations such as sporting clubs, hall/reserve committees of management and fire brigades to improve amenities and upgrade equipment that will help them keep up with modern times and technology," she said.

WORKS UNDERWAY AT LONGWOOD RECREATION RESERVE

Limb removal of two large Red Box trees located either side of the Longwood Football Netball clubrooms will make it safer for users of the oval.

The Department of Environment, Land, Water and Planning (DELWP) are working with Council and the Longwood Recreation Reserve Committee of Management to start work, which will also include removing dead wood from the tree canopies.

An arborist's assessment was requested by Council to establish the health of the trees, asking the work be done.

Local arborist Steve Wright (Wright Out Tree and Stump Removal) has been engaged to complete the works.

In addition to the limb removal project, Council will be erecting bollards around both trees to restrict vehicle access and parking.

Driving or parking vehicles under trees has a detrimental effect on the root system, which restricts the penetration of water and the ability for the soil to breathe.

Soil compaction forces the water to run off, eventually starving the tree of moisture and nutrients.

The establishment of mulch and understory plants will help provide the necessary protection for their survival.

The tree located next to the canteen has been identified as a Significant Tree on the National Register of Big Trees.

Both trees in question form a significant part of the aesthetics of the reserve and DELWP is pleased to be working with interested parties to retain them.

DISCONTINUATION OF CHINAMAN'S BRIDGE

The heritage-listed Chinaman's Bridge, which opened in 1891, was declared Main Road connecting Nagambie and Heathcote.

In 1995, following a road realignment of the Nagambie-Heathcote Road onto a new replacement bridge, VicRoads removed the Main Road status from Chinaman's Bridge but retained a more general road status in its place.

The bridge has now fallen into a state of disrepair and is hazardous to the public using the Goulburn River Reserve and boating traffic on the river.

Since 2015, Council has been encouraging VicRoads to mitigate the public risk and has therefore recommended the road along the bridge be permanently closed.

At last month's Ordinary Meeting, Councillors voted to close the bridge and to advertise this to the public.

Submissions to the bridge's closure will be accepted until January 6, with submissions heard at a Special Council Meeting on January 24 and considered in the February Ordinary Meeting in 2017.

MEETING MINUTES

Strathbogie Shire Councillors have adopted an Amendment to the Strathbogie Planning Scheme for re-zoning of 30 hectares of land in Nagambie.

The re-zoning (from farming to industrial) will provide for industrial opportunities along Habel Road (Nagambie), which will allow for new industry to come to the Shire.

This decision was made at the Planning Committee Meeting on November 22 and will now be referred to the Minister for Planning for final approval.

Up to 100 equivalent full time positions could be created following the amendment, with a positive flow-on effect for tourism and economic development.

IMPORTANT CHANGE IN NEWSLETTER FREQUENCY

Due to a change in process requested by the new Council, *Love Strathbogie* will now be going quarterly to all households in 2017.

WATERWAY SAFETY

Strathbogie Shire Council is urging users of its waterways to be safe this summer.

Many water sports take place at Lake Nagambie, including rowing regattas and canoe polo.

Council is working with Maritime Safety Victoria (MSV) to address the small minority of boaters intent on anti-social behaviour on the waterway, as seen by users and nearby residents last boating season.

In Victoria alone, there are 191,000 registered recreational boat users. There are 395,000 marine license holders and 838,000 adult recreational fishers.

Since 2013, there have been 15,000 more boat users in Victoria alone and there is no doubt that many of them have utilised the pristine Lake Nagambie.

Boating provides a \$4.5 billion contribution to the Victorian economy, providing 17,700 full time jobs within the industry.

When using the waterways, ensure you are always wearing a personal flotation device and carry the required safety equipment as MSV and Council boating safety officers will issue infringement notices.

Maritime rules apply to all forms of recreational use on Lake Nagambie including boating, jet-skiing, swimming, canoeing and fishing.

What contamination have we found in your organic bins?

Please note that any contaminants placed in your green organics bin have to be sorted by the processor and taken to landfill, resulting in additional costs to Council for landfill disposal.

The contaminants being found in our organic bins are a mixture of:

- Plastic bags, including 'biodegradable' plastic bags. Remember that plastic bags are not compostable and must be placed in your red rubbish bin. Food and garden waste should only be placed into your green bin loosely or contained within a purple, compostable liner supplied by Council.
- General household waste (including disposable nappies, plastic food wrap and polystyrene meat trays). These things must also go in your red bin.
- General household recyclables (including food tins, plastic bottles/containers and paper). These must go in your yellow recycling bin.
