MEET YOUR NEW COUNCILLORS

The Shire of Strathbogie has elected their new Councillors for the next four years in what was the most hotly contested election in the Council's history.

Council veteran Mick Williams was re-elected for his seventh consecutive term as one of the two Seven Creeks ward Councillors.

He was joined by newcomer John Mason, with the two receiving the most votes out of eight candidates – the most the popular ward has ever had in its 20 year history.

Former Mayor Deb Swan was re-elected for her third term as one of Lake Nagambie Ward Councillors, with Graytown

BURNING OFF OUTSIDE FIRE PERIOD

With the 2016-17 Fire Danger Period fast approaching, residents are reminded of the Local Law of burning off before fire restrictions are in place.

If any residents have anything to burn off, and/or live in a builtup area, they must do so between 8am and 3pm on either Monday, Wednesday, Saturday or Sunday.

According to Council's Local Law (No. 6), the following rules must be followed when using enclosed incinerators and/or burning in the open air:

- A person in a built up area must not burn in an incinerator or in the open air outside the prescribed days/times unless the prior consent of an authorised officer has been notified.
- A person burning in an incinerator must ensure that it is enclosed to prevent embers, ash and soot escaping from it.

• A person must not burn in an incinerator or in the open air materials that are likely to be offensive, including any chemicals, rubbers/plastics, petrol products/oil, paint/ paint containers or food wastes (e.g. fish).

If these rules aren't followed, penalties will apply.

To report a burn-off, contact the Shire's Compliance Officer on 5795 0031 (business hours) or 5795 0000 (after hours) and be sure to call the VicFire Burn-Off Notification line on 1800 668 511.

The Fire Danger Period will begin in line with recent weather conditions.

If you do not have an enclosed incinerator, a permit to burn is required.

- January 16-20, 9am-1pm

The pools won't be open to the public during the VICSWIM programs both for patrons' safety and added enjoyment.

Children must be four years or older to be in the program.

ONE STEP CLOSER TO 'SHOW COURT'

Euroa netballers are one step closer to acquiring a second netball court at the memorial oval.

The 'Show Court' will solve the 'logistical nightmare' that the club currently experiences with the high number of netballers using the sporting facility.

Last month, they raised almost \$60,000 at a goods and services auction, which is an astonishing achievement considering the court sub-committee (consisting of both junior and senior club members) expected to raise half that amount.

The club was successful this year in acquiring \$50,000 from Strathbogie Shire Council in the 2016-17 Budget and Council Plan.

But now that the club has exceeded the \$75,000 needed to apply for state government funding, the next crucial step is to apply for a \$100,000 football/netball grant before December 5.

EQUESTRIAN OPPORTUNITIES FOR SHADFORTH RESERVE

What activity do you think would enhance one of Strathbogie Shire's hidden gems?

This seems to be a question often asked by ratepayers and was the focus of a Listening Post discussion in Violet Town last week.

Shadforth Reserve, which was once a racing track, has accommodated notable sporting clubs such as the former Violet Town Golf Club and now the Jumping Classic.

While the Classic, particularly, is an event ideally located at Shadforth, the reserve has the potential to accommodate sporting clubs/groups all year round.

The Interim Shadforth Committee of Management is working with Spiire (planning consultants) to identify the development opportunities that exist at Shadforth for the benefit of the community and to develop a Master Plan to guide and attract future investment and grant funding.

Last week's Listening Post ensured all opportunities are considered in the areas of sport, recreation, environment and economic development.

The idea of the Master Plan is to also identify the range of equestrian and complementary community uses that could be accommodated at Shadforth.

Spiire will now develop a draft opportunities document which will be brought back to the community for further consultation at Shadforth Reserve on Thursday, December 8, all are welcome to attend.
