## OUTDOOR STAFF RESPOND TO OVER 100 FALLEN TREES IN SHIRE

Last month's wet and windy weather in the Shire of Strathbogie has seen Council's outdoor staff respond to more than 150 fallen trees throughout the region.

With the works crew mainly busy in the Ruffy and Strathbogie areas, fallen trees have blocked a number of rural roads and walking tracks.

No matter the time of day or night, Strathbogie Shire's outdoor staff ensures the job gets done.

Possibly the biggest trees down in the Euroa area were along Frost Street, opposite the entrance to the Euroa Showgrounds and meters from the Euroa Butter Factory.

Two older trees have fallen directly over the Seven Creeks and

have broken an old communication line near the railway line. Shire staff Dale Brooker and Dave Mackrell (pictured above) recently cleared the Frost Street side of the Apex Walking Track, which was blocked by fallen limbs for a number of weeks.

Strathbogie Shire Council would like to thank and recognise the hard work undertaken by all outdoor staff, who have gone above and beyond the call of duty.

# EUROA'S HISTORY DISPLAYED ON BINNEY ST

Two historical columns depicting the beginning of Euroa and its origins have been installed on Binney Street.

Coordinated and partly funded by the Euroa Community Action Group (ECAG), as well as Council, the columns can be found at the northern end of Binney Street outside the Euroa Pharmacy and Mawson's Bakery Café.

Costing over \$4000, the columns were made by Ford McKernan Engineering and designed by Burgess Signs in Seymour.

ECAG liaised with the Euroa Historical and Genealogical Society on obtaining old photographs and text, which was sent to Burgess Signs to design.

Each side panel shows sporting achievements, old buildings as well as Aboriginal designs and major weather events.

# WINDOW NEEDS A HOME

Work is almost complete on the restoration of a 113-year-old stained glass Boer War memorial window, named after former Strathbogie Shire resident Private John Charlton.

The window was installed at St Paul's Anglican Church, Euroa in 1903 and remained there for almost 30 years before being taken down and packed away under the floorboards while the church was renovated.

In 1980, the forgotten windows were found and decisions were being made as to what to do with them.

The windows were moved to the Balmattum Church, back to St Paul's storage shed and the Euroa Historical and Genealogical Society, where an archaeology student doing her thesis on war memorials started researching the windows' historical significance.

The windows were again relocated to a disused church at Caveat where they were gently cleaned, photographed and researched – and a team was assembled to secure funding for the windows' restoration.

They received a grant of almost \$40,000 from the State Government and Victorian Veterans Council, which allowed for the total restoration and reframing of the windows – but a new, permanent home is still being sought.

The team contacted Strathbogie Shire Council for help but the size and scale of the windows became a limiting factor.

Other locations outside the Shire are still being explored and a final destination will be announced in the future.



# TIDY TOWNS AWARD WINNER

A group focused on acknowledging three Victoria Cross recipients in the Strathbogie Shire has received a sustainable community award for their achievements.

The Honouring Our Heroes Committee, who heavily campaigned and fundraised to have three life-size, bronze statues created and placed in a purpose-built park outside the Euroa RSL, was awarded a Tidy Town Victoria Award in the 2016 Sustainable Communities category.

The committee was formed back in 2010 where a group of like-minded residents came together to recognise the valiant efforts of World War 1 soldiers Leslie Cecil Maygar, Frederick Harold Tubb and Alexander Stewart Burton, who all hailed from Longwood, Ruffy and Euroa respectively.

Keep Victoria Beautiful program manager Gary Mogford, one of the Tidy Town award organisers, said the Community Action and Leadership category was always strongly contested, with a number of entries in 2016.

"It (the award category) recognises outstanding achievement in protecting, enhancing and promoting environmental sustainability through actions which contribute positively to the community, demonstrate leadership or foster community spirit and build stronger communities," he said.

The committee heavily fundraised, receiving donations from Regional Development Victoria, the TPI Association, Strathbogie Shire Council and more.

Fully supported by the community, the entire project, which included landscaping of the newly dubbed VC Memorial Park, took five years from concept to completion in 2014.



Honouring Our Heroes chairman Neville Harris (pictured) said the accolade was a very pleasant recognition of amenity created for the town.

Strathbogie Shire Council will also receive three commemorative pavers (75cm<sup>2</sup> each, made of bluestone) for Burton, Maygar and Tubb.

The State Government will deliver the pavers before the end of the year, with Council to find a permanent spot for them.
