NOMINATIONS OPEN FOR AUSTRALIA DAY AWARDS 2017

Nominations are now open for the 2017 Australia Day Awards.

Do you know someone who has shown considerable dedication to the community?

Or is there a local organisation or community event that stands out?

If so, put pen to paper and fill in an Australia Day Award nomination form at the Council office in Euroa, Nagambie Visitor Information Centre, the Euroa Hub or download it from www.strathbogie.vic.gov.au (under Community < Community Resources).

The award categories are:

- Community Organisation of the Year
- Community Event of the Year (event after 27/01/2016)
- Junior Citizen of the Year (under-15 at 26/01/2017)
- Young Citizen of the Year (between 15-25 at 26/01/2017)
- Citizen of the Year (over 25 at 26/01/2017)

On Thursday, January 26 next year, there will be Australia Day celebrations in Avenel, Euroa, Longwood, Nagambie, Strathbogie (main event) and Violet Town.

Nominations close 5pm sharp on Wednesday, November 2, 2016. Late nominations will not be accepted.

NEW PLANNING FEES IN EFFECT

As of October 13, applications for Planning and Subdivision will need to have the new relevant application fee when lodged for consideration.

In October 2015, the Minister for Planning commenced a review of the planning and subdivision fees.

These fees have not been reviewed since 2009 and the review focused on several points which included the cost of delivering planning and subdivision functions (direct and indirect costs) and planning and subdivision functions for which fees should be charged.

The Governor in Council made new planning and subdivision regulations on September 27 and stated these will apply from October 13 2016.

CASE STUDY ON WASTE COLLECTION SERVICES

Strathbogie Shire is one of three Goulburn Valley councils selected to develop case studies on optimising kerbside waste collection services throughout the state.

Sustainability Victoria (SV), the State Government's authority for state-wide waste management strategy and planning, has also chosen Moira Shire and Greater Shepparton City Council for the project.

The three were amongst the first within the state to introduce a Food Organics and Garden Organics (FOGO) kerbside collection service and have commenced work with SV to create documentation and visual presentations, showcasing the successes and lessons learned from the introduction of their services.

SV will use these case studies as a means of providing valuable information to other Victorian Councils, as they consider moving to food and garden organics collection services in the future.

Council is hoping to be able to communicate the information developed to residents once complete.

FUNDING OPTIONS OPEN TO NEW COUNCIL FOR POOLS

The Strathbogie Shire's Pools Working Group is making some great progress to ensure the survival of the municipality's four swimming pools. Various funding announcements were discussed at a recent meeting with the State Government.

A representative from Sport and Recreation Victoria (SRV), who presented to Council's Pools Working Group, revealed there were two categories of annual funding available for swimming pools and aquatic centres across Victoria.

The Small Aquatic Grants has \$200,000 maximum available, purely for upgrades to pools and facilities, accessibility, solar heating and splash pools.

However, these grants do not fund maintenance – it needs to go to something new or an upgrade.

The funding is provided on a \$2 to \$1 ratio (for every \$2 the State Government provides, Council provides \$1).

The Major Aquatic Grants are for a maximum of \$3 million and

are for new or redeveloped facilities and spaces such as new indoor pools, gyms, outdoor pools and more.

This funding is provided on a \$1 for \$1 ratio.

The SRV spokesperson said the main thing they looked for in applications were:

- Strategic planning, key stakeholder consultation
- How the project will increase pool patronage (i.e. introducing aqua aerobics, water polo)
- Community fundraising and support

The application process could take up to 2-3 years, with SRV potentially working with Council during this time.

While both grant applications have closed for the year, Council, through the working group, will continue to plan long-term and help develop the Shire-Wide Aquatic Strategy, which the new Council will use to form a decision on the pools' future.

The next Pools Working Group meeting will be held in November.

PROJECTS AND WORKS

EUROA SALEYARDS STAGE 2

Despite the wet weather Euroa has been experiencing, work on stage two of the Euroa Saleyards project is still progressing. The power lines have been relocated and the construction of an additional laneway, to improve the circulation of cattle, is being completed.

With only three cattle sales planned for the remainder of the year, the contractor will continue with fabrication of steelwork for the roof extension and construction will continue towards the end of the year and through into 2017.

Stage two comprises almost \$500,000 worth of works (funded by the State Government) conducted by Don Newnham Engineering of Euroa.

Work will include a roof extension to cover an additional 52 pens as well as the construction of a brand new general kiosk/office area



ROWE STREET



Extensive wet weather has caused a delay in the Rowe Street drainage project. However, Rowe Street residents have agreed that the new underground drainage is working well in the partially completed area. The remainder of the drainage work will be completed by the end of the year.

The next Nagambie Farmers Market will be held on Sunday, November 27.

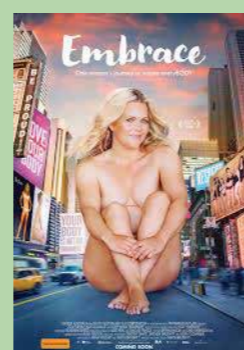

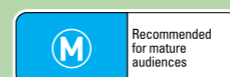

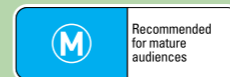

BUSINESS BIN DAYS

Due to overwhelming support from business owners in Euroa's Binney/Railway Street shopping precinct, Strathbogie Shire Council's bin collection day has been changed from Monday to Tuesday.

The changes were put into effect on Tuesday, October 4 and will continue indefinitely.

Please note that with this change in collection day, all bins are required to be placed out on Binney/Railway Street for collection early Tuesday Mornings.

However, the bin collection service for all residential areas in Euroa will remain the same, with collections taking place on Monday mornings.
