5.7.1 Rowe Street Drainage and Road Widening Project – Special Charge Scheme

Author and Department

The author of this report and officers/contractors providing advice in relation to this report do not have a direct or indirect interest, as provided in accordance with the Local Government Act 1989.

Summary

Council, at its Ordinary Meeting held on December 15, 2015 resolved to give public notice of its intention to declare a Special Charge for the construction of drainage and road widening of Rowe Street, Euroa.

The notice invited submissions under Section 163(A), 163(B) and 223 of the Local Government Act 1989 (The Act), which were heard at the Special Council meeting of February 9, 2016.

Council can now consider the submissions and consider the Declaration of Special Charge in accordance with previous resolutions and the Public Notice.

RECOMMENDATION

That:

- 1. Strathbogie Shire Council having considered all submissions received and taken account of all objections lodged and complied with the requirements of sections 163A, 163B and 223 of the Local Government Act 1989 (Act), and otherwise according to law and having, so far as can be ascertained from available records and can reasonably be concluded, ascertained that the Road or any component of the Road for which it is proposed the Special Charge will be declared has not previously been constructed by way of a Special Rate or Special Charge, hereby declares a Special Charge (Special Charge) under section 163(1) of the Act for the purposes of defraying expenses incurred or to be incurred by Council in relation to the widening of Rowe Street, Euroa between Garret Street and Euroa-Shepparton Road, Euroa, and the provision of any ancillary works including drainage (Road or Scheme).
- 2. The criteria which form the basis of the proposed declaration of the Special Charge are the ownership of rateable land in the area of the Scheme which, based on frontage (modified where appropriate), has and enjoys an abuttal to or access from the Road, which rateable land is situated within the geographical area in which the properties described in paragraphs 7 and 8 of this declaration are included.

- 3. In declaring the Special Charge, Council is performing functions and exercising powers in relation to the peace, order and good government of the municipal district of the Strathbogie Shire, in particular the provision of proper, safe and suitable roads and property services within the area for which the proposed Special Charge is declared.
- 4. The total cost of the performance of the function and the exercise of the power by Council (in relation to the provision of proper, safe and suitable roads and property services in the area for which the Special Charge is declared) is \$200,000 being the estimated cost of the works to be undertaken.
- 5. The total estimate amount to be levied under the Scheme as the Special Charge is \$100,000.
- 6. The Special Charge will commence on 1st July 2016 and remain in force for a period of 10 years.
- 7. The area for which the Special Charge is declared is all of the land shown on the plan set out in the attachment forming a part of this declaration (being Attachment 1).
- 8. The land in relation to which the Special Charge is declared is all that rateable land described in the listing of rateable properties set out in the attachment forming a part of this declaration (being Attachment 2)
- 9. The Special Charge will be declared and assessed in accordance with the amounts set out alongside each property in the attachment forming a part of this declaration (being Attachment 2), such amounts having respectively been assessed based on the length of the frontage which a property included in the Scheme has to the Road.
- 10. The Special Charge will be levied by sending a notice of levy in the prescribed form annually to the person who is liable to pay the Special Charge.
- 11. Because the performance of the function and the exercise of the power in respect of which the Special Charge is declared and levied relates substantially to capital works, the Special Charge will be levied on the basis of an instalment plan being given to ratepayers where by
 - a. quarterly instalments are to be paid over a 10 year period, or other period as negotiated; and
 - b. quarterly instalments will include a component for reasonable interest costs, the total of which will not exceed the estimated borrowing costs of Council in respect of the construction of the Road by more than 1%.

- 5.7.1 Rowe Street Drainage and Road Widening Project Special Charge Scheme (cont)
 - 12. Council will consider special cases of financial hardship and may reconsider other payment options for the Special Charge.
 - 13. No incentives will be given for payment of the Special Charge before the due date for payment.
 - 14. The Council considers that there will be a special benefit to the persons required to pay the Special Charge because there will be a benefit to those persons that is over and above, or greater than the benefit that is available to persons who are not subject to the Special Charge, and directly and indirectly as a result of the expenditure of the Special Charge the value and the use, occupation and enjoyment of the properties included in the Special Charge Scheme area will be maintained or enhanced though the provision of proper, safe, and suitable roads and property services. Without limitation, Council considers that the works to be provided under the Special Charge Scheme will:
 - a. improve vehicular access to and from the properties abutting on or accessing the Road via the works;
 - b. improve safety and amenity for motorists, cyclists and pedestrians;
 - c. allow vehicles to park on hard stand area;
 - d. eliminate water ponding on road verges and nature strips;
 - e. reduce erosion and sediment transfer, and
 - f. enhance the amenity and character of the land and the local area.
 - 15. For the purposes of having determined the total amount of the Special Charge to be levied under the Scheme, Council further considers and formally determines for the purposes of sections 163(2)(a), (2A) and (2B) of the Act that the estimated proportion of the total benefits of the Scheme to which the performance for the function and the exercise of the power relates (including all special benefits and community benefits) that will accrue as special benefits to all of the persons who a liable to pay the Special Charge is in ratio of 100:0 (or 100%). This is on the basis that, in the opinion of Council there are no tangible and direct Community benefits.
 - 16. Notice to be given to all owners of properties included in the Scheme and all persons who have lodged a submission and/or objection in writing of the decision of Council to declare and levy the Special Charge commencing on July 1, 2016, and the reasons for the decision.
 - 17. For the purpose of paragraph 16, the reasons for the decision of Council to declare the Special Charges are that:
 - a. There is minimal objection to the Scheme and it is otherwise considered that there is broad support for the Special Charge from all property owners;

- b. Council considers that it is acting in accordance with the functions and powers conferred on it under the *Local Government Act* 1989, having regard to its role, purposes and objectives under the Act, particularly in relation to the provision of proper, safe and suitable roads and property services in the Scheme area;
- c. All persons who are liable or required to pay the Special Charge and the properties respectively owned by them will receive a special benefit in the form of an enhancement or maintenance in land values and/or a maintenance or enhancement in use, occupation and enjoyment of the properties;
- d. The basis of distribution of the Special Charge amongst those persons who are liable or required to pay the Special Charge is considered to be fair and reasonable;
- e. The works proposed by the Scheme are consistent with the policies and objectives set out in the Planning Scheme for the area; and
- f. The works proposed for the construction of the Road are necessary, reasonable, not excessive, sufficient, suitable and not costly having regard to the locality or environment and to the probable use of the Road.

Background

Council directed that public notice of the intention to declare a Special Charge be given in the Euroa Gazette and the Age. The dates of publication were

Euroa Gazette 23/12/2015 Age 19/12/2015

Council also directed that separate letters enclosing a copy of the notice be sent to the owners of properties within the Special Charge area. An advance copy of the notice was forwarded on 16/12/2015 and follow up copies of the actual advertisement were sent on December 22, 2015.

The advertisement advised that:

Any person may make a written submission to the Council under sections 163A and 223 of the Act.

In addition, any person who will be required to pay the Special Charge to be imposed by the proposed declaration has a right to object to the proposed declaration and may also make a written objection to the Council under section 163B of the Act.

Submissions

Two letters of objection were received. Both letters made reference to Section 163B(1) of the Act but provided no information on the basis of the objections. Copies of the letters were provided to Councillors. Both submitters requested to be heard but only one submitter attended and addressed the Special Council meeting of February 9, 2016.

The submitter indicated his dissatisfaction with:

- 1. An estimate being used to develop the proposed declaration of Special Charge.
- 2. The period of notice given to an objector to prepare to be heard, particularly over the Christmas New Year period, and
- 3. The possibility of a Special Charge Scheme being declared on other works, where he could be included as a contributor.

Officers Comments

The following information is relevant in relation to the three matters raised by the submitter.

1. Estimate

It is standard practice to use an Engineers estimate as the basis for consultation with landowners and for development of a proposed Special Charge Scheme.

The use of an estimate was confirmed in the response to Ministerial Guidelines provided in the agenda for the Ordinary Meeting of December 15, 2015. Reference was also made to the upper limits of 10% increase for each of:

- Landowner liability arising from submissions or objections, and
- Cost overrun in the construction phase.

In consultation with landowners, costings were identified within a range which included 20% allowance for these matters.

In any case, and in fairness to Contractors, Council only invites tenders for any works when funding is confirmed. This occurs, in the case of a Special Charge Scheme upon the declaration of Special Charge.

2. Period of Notice

The date of February 9, 2016 was given for the hearing of submissions in the Public Notice which invited the submissions.

It appeared in The Age on December 19, 2015 and in the Euroa Gazette on December 23, 2015.

3. Other Special Charge Schemes

The Special Charge Scheme provisions in the Act are considered to be a valuable tool for Council to deliver projects of particular benefit to groups of landowners.

Council's processes of community consultation will give landowners every opportunity to participate in the development of future Special Charge Schemes.

Should Council resolve to declare the Special Charge, the information can be conveyed to the objectors, together with reasons for decision as prepared in the recommendation.

There appears to be no impediment to Council proceeding to declare the Special Charge.

Alternative Options

The author has considered potential alternative courses of action. No feasible alternatives have been identified



Terms of Reference 2016

Aim:

To listise with community members and provide advice and recommendations to Strathbogie Shire Council regarding access and equity.

Objectives:

- Work in partnership with the community and Strathbogie Shire Council towards acknowledging and valuing people of all abilities.
- Promote consultation and ensure participation mechanisms are in place for people with a disability, their carers, advocates and service providers to have meaningful input into Strathbogie Shire Council service planning and policy development.
- 3. Support and raise community awareness of the rights of persons with a disability.

Membership:

The Access and Disability Advisory Committee (ADAC) should comprise the following:

Members with voting rights:

- People with a disability
- Rural Access Officer
- Carers
- Strathbogie Shire Council nominated Councillor
- Service providers & Community members/service clubs

Members with no voting rights:

- Strathbogie Shire Council Community Development Officer, Access and Inclusion
- Strathbogie Shire Council Senior staff member

A minimum of 50% of the ADAC membership must be living with a disability.

Committee Conduct Principles:

ADAC members are expected to:

- Actively participate in Committee discussions and offer their opinions and views
- Treat all persons with respect and have due regard to the opinions, rights and responsibilities of others
- Act with integrity, avoid conflicts of interest and the releasing of confidential information
- Attend each meeting where practical, with a minimum of 50% of scheduled meetings





Key Selection Criteria:

The ADAC member will be able to demonstrate the following criteria:

- Knowledge and understanding of the needs and issues affecting people with a disability, their families and carers
- An interest and involvement in local community affairs, advocacy and networks
- An interest and understanding of Local Government services and programs from a disability perspective
- The ability to contribute to the strategic development of disability policy at local government level
- Willingness to commit to a 2 year appointment
- Willingness to abide by the principles of the Strathbogie Shire Council Privacy Policy

The ADAC will ensure that members of the Committee reflect the diversity within the Strathbogie Shire community including ethnicity, age, gender and geographical locations.

Recruitment:

When vacancies arise the following process will be adhered to for the recruitment of new members:

- Community Development Officer advertises in media (local Newspapers and Newsletters, social media, website) asking for expressions of interest
- After expressions of interest are received the Community Development Officer contacts the Enquirer
- Community Development Officer sends application pack to the Enquirer, including:
 - Letter of acknowledgement
 - ADAC information flyer
 - Terms of Reference
 - Application form
 - Strathbogie Shire Council self-addressed envelope
- Upon receipt of completed application the Enquirer is asked to present for an interview with Community Development Officer, Rural Access Officer and one ADAC member
- The recruitment panel will assess the Enquirer against the selection criteria
- Enquirer will be contacted within 5 working days of the interview and advised of outcome:
 - If not accepted the enquirer will be advised by the Community Development Officer that they did not meet the selection criteria
 - If accepted the new ADAC member is forwarded a letter of offer, the Strathbogie Shire
 Council Privacy Policy, a copy of the previous minutes and the next meeting date
- New ADAC members will undergo induction with the Community Development Officer prior to attending their first meeting





Principles of Operation:

- The ADAC will meet every six weeks, to a maximum of ten times per year
- The Community Development Officer shall be the convener of the Access and Disability Advisory
 Committee
- The agenda will be circulated by the Community Development Officer to members one week prior to the meeting to be held
- The meeting will be chaired by the Rural Access Officer
- The Community Development Officer will take minutes and ensure these are circulated to members within one week of a meeting being held

Reporting Mechanisms:

Communicating with Council:

- ADAC Recommendations to be reported to Executive Management Team via the Community
 Development Officer
- ADAC Meeting minutes are to be tabled at the Council Meeting following the ADAC meeting including any recommendations
- The ADAC nominated Councillor will provide Council with a briefing following the ADAC meeting
- Advice and information requested by the ADAC from Council will be communicated through the
 Community Development Officer

Communicating with community members:

- Members of the ADAC will listen to issues raised by community members and report back to the ADAC
- Community concerns will be a standing agenda item at each ADAC meeting and members given the opportunity to discuss any issues that have been raised with them
- Any issues that then need to be taken to Executive Management Team or Council will follow the "Communicating with Council" guidelines above
- ADAC members will advise community members that the ADAC member cannot act individually
 or provide an immediate response without consulting the group as any decisions rests with
 Council

Review of Document:

The review of the Terms of Reference will occur 1 year after adoption by Strathbogie Shire Council and then bi-annually thereafter.

Any amendments to the Terms of Reference must be referred to Strathbogie Shire Council for formal adoption by resolution at a Council meeting.

5.7.3 Mid-Year Budget Review 2015/2016

Disclosure of Interest

Summary

The 2015/2016 Mid-Year Budget review provides the opportunity to undertake a detailed analysis of Council's Operating and Capital Budgets. The process involves estimating the end of financial year position for all programs within Council's strategic objectives.

The report contains the Income Statement, Balance Sheet, Cash Flow Statement and Statement of Capital Works.

The Income Statement changes identified in the mid-year review process are primarily the consequence of:

- Prepayment of 2015/16 Victorian Grants Commission funding in June 2015.
- Increased Roads to Recovery funding for 2015/16 and consequent additional capital works.
- Additional unbudgeted grants funding and consequent expenditures.
- Increased waste management services costs and offsetting waste management charges.
- Additional unbudgeted contributions.
- Net increase in materials and contractor costs.

The reviewed Balance Sheet reflects the actual position reported in the 30 June 2015 financial statements. This includes a significant adjustment for an infrastructure assets revaluation increment of \$26.7 million at 30 June 2015.

The Balance Sheet and Capital Works reports are also impacted by significant increases in unbudgeted capital grants. It is expected that some of these works will be carried forward to 2016/17.

Specific details of the Mid-Year Review variations and the updated financial statements are attached for the information of Council.

RECOMMENDATION

That:

- 1. Council receive the 2015/2016 Mid-Year Budget Review Report.
- 2. Council approve the changes to the financial statements, as identified in the attachments.

5.7.3 Mid-Year Budget Review 2015/2016 (cont.)

Background

The 2015/2016 Budget was prepared in accordance with the Local Government Act 1989, and was formally adopted at a Special Meeting of Council held on Tuesday 9 June 2015. A full mid-year review has now been carried out.

The attached reports provide details of the changes identified in the mid-year review process. The changes have now been incorporated in the attached financial statements

Alternative Options

The Officer providing advice in relation to this report has considered all alternative courses of action. The option presented represents the forecast position of Council at 30 June 2016.

Risk Management

Monitoring of the 2015/2016 adopted Budget provides for prudent financial management and ensures that Council is made aware of any known or potential financial risks. This review has resulted in adjustments for known variances and, therefore, reduces the risk that the actual results will significantly differ from the budget.

Strategic Links – policy implications and relevance to Council Plan

This report is consistent with Council Policies, the Long Term Financial Plan and the Council Plan. The report also addresses Council's desire to review all aspects of Council's operations.
