SUNSUPER'S DREAMS FOR A BETTER WORLD BUSINESS GRANTS

\$5000 is granted to the three applicants chosen by judges. The three winners then have the opportunity to pitch their application to the judges and the grand final winner receives an additional \$10,000. Applications close 2nd August 2019.

Native Vegetation Removal

Sometimes a planning permit or other approval is required to remove, destroy or lop vegetation, including dead trees.

Council encourages anyone considering vegetation removal on either public or private land, to first complete our Native Vegetation Removal Request Form, which can be accessed by **clicking the Native Vegetation button on our website at www.strathbogie.vic.gov.au**.

A planning permit may be required to remove vegetation from public or private land if:

- The vegetation is native to Victoria
- The property is affected by a particular planning overlay
- A planning permit has previously been issued for the property and contains conditions or requirements relating to vegetation

However, there are various exemptions from needing a planning permit to remove vegetation. These include exemptions under bushfire regulations and other specific considerations such as existing buildings and fencing.

Removing vegetation without a planning permit, when a planning permit is required, is a finable offence.

Fire Safety Improvements in the Strathbogie Shire

Council is pleased to advise there was an approximate 60% reduction in Fire Prevention Notices issued to properties in the 2018-19 fire season compared to the 2017-18 season.

There was also an approximate 90% reduction in grass fires in urban areas in the Strathbogie Shire this season compared to last season.

Congratulations to our communities on their diligence in preparing for the fire season by reducing fire hazards on their properties.

We support the Uluru Statement From the Heart

We have recently thrown our support behind the Violet Town and District Recognise Group to promote and support the Uluru Statement from the Heart movement and the process for Aboriginal recognition in the Constitution.

Councillors endorsed six recommendations at a recent Ordinary Council Meeting that supported the sentiments contained in the Uluru Statement from the Heart, the process for Aboriginal recognition and reform of the Constitution and a referendum to enshrine a First Nations Voice to Federal Parliament.

We have a role to play in advocating on behalf of our community on issues that are important to them. The Uluru Statement from the Heart is a powerful piece of writing outlining the dispossession and disparity experienced by our First Nations People, but encouragingly, and generously, opens the door for all of us to walk with them on a journey forward.

We will be putting forward a recommendation to the State Council of the Municipal Association of Victoria in May 2019 to bring the importance of the Uluru Statement of the Heart to the attention of the state-wide local government sector.

Responsible Pet Ownership

Strathbogie Shire Council values its furry residents and wants them to be happy and healthy.

As a responsible pet owner, it is your duty to provide care and attention to your pets to ensure they are happy, healthy and safe. Part of this is knowing your responsibilities as an owner and local law requirements, as well as being considerate of other people and pets who share public spaces.

Advice for dog and cat owners



- Dogs and cats need to be microchipped and registered with Council when they are 3 months old. This means that your animal can be identified and returned home if they become lost.
- Animal registrations are due on 10th April each year. Please contact Council if you need to register a new animal.
- The law requires you to keep your dogs and cats within the boundaries of your property for its safety and the safety of people and other animals. This means your yard must have a closed gate and an escape proof fence.
- If you find a roaming or stray dog or cat, please call Council's Local Laws Ranger as soon as possible and we will do our best to reunite the pet with its owner.
- If your pet is missing, it is important to start looking for it as soon as you can. Make sure you contact Council's Local Laws Ranger with a description of the animal and where it was last seen so we can keep an eye out for it.
- Please make sure you look at the Strathbogie Shire Facebook Page as we post about dogs and cats in our pound on social media to try and reunite them with their owners.
- Make sure your dog is on a leash when walking in public spaces. We are working on identifying a suitable off leash area and are currently reviewing valuable community feedback for suitable locations, but in the meantime you must keep your dog on a leash when outside your property.
- Cats tend to roam free when outdoors; this can expose them to dangers such as being hit by vehicles. Please be mindful of where your cat is located, particularly during the night.
- Pets must not be left unattended in cars, even with the windows open. Even on mild days, temperatures inside a car can quickly rise and become fatal.
- Dog droppings must be cleaned up in public places. You can use plastic (or biodegradable) bags, trowels or pooper scoopers.
- Make sure your pet is getting regular checks at the vet. How often you should take your dog to the vet depends on their age and health status, so it is important to check with your local veterinary clinic for advice.

Barking Dogs

Excessive dog barking can be irritating and disruptive for neighbours.

If your neighbour's dog is barking frequently, we encourage you to politely approach the dog's owner about the matter as they may be unaware of the nuisance their dog is causing you, especially if the barking occurs when they're not home.

If you cannot resolve the issue with your neighbour and the problem continues, then please contact the Local Laws Ranger on **1800 065 993** to lodge a complaint.

We will ask you to complete a complaint form and also keep a noise log for seven days so that we can measure the level of barking occurring. Our Ranger will work with you and the dog owner to try to resolve the complaint.
