





As Australia is gripped by an unprecedented bushfire crisis, Strathbogie Shire residents are being urged to continue to be vigilant and prepared.

Residents should not only prepare their property, but have a plan of action in place in case they are required to leave their property at short notice.

It is important to remove all flammable material from outside your home, ensure grass and weeds are kept short and prune low hanging branches from trees and shrubs.

Residents that live on rural property neighbouring urban housing must ensure there is a minimum 20-metre firebreak between the properties.

The CFA advises residents to make decisions about which fire danger rating will trigger them to leave.

Residents are urged to make a firm plan if they will leave that morning or the night before and where they will go.


Other factors to consider are:

- What routes will you take and what is the alternative to this route in the event the fire changes direction?
- What will you take with you?
- Do you need to organise pets and livestock?
- Who are you going to inform of your plan and movements?
- Are there other family members or friends you need to help or check up on?
- What means of communication will you use to stay informed about warnings and updates?

CFA officials also advise residents to have a back-up plan if they cannot leave their home during the fire.

# Be a responsible **PET OWNER**



# A reminder that animal registrations will be due in April.

Dogs and cats over three months of age must be registered and must also be microchipped before the new registration period.

Having your pet registered is important for a number of reasons including improving the chances of it being returned if it becomes lost.

Strathbogie Shire Council will send out renewal notices to existing pet owners in the coming months.

Residents who do not receive the renewal notice by April 1 are urged to contact Council, as all renewals are due on April 10.

Council also asks residents to check the renewal notice carefully to ensure the owner and pet's details are correct.

New pet owners can contact Council on 1800 065 993 for an application.



As the temperature continues to climb over the summer months, it is important for residents to take adequate steps to beat the heat.

Heat kills more Australians each year than natural disasters with statistics showing heatstroke to be fatal in 80 per cent of cases.

Victorian health officials advise young children, the elderly or people who are sick are the most vulnerable to suffering heatstroke.

There are simple steps that can be taken to stay safe this summer

- H2O: Drink plenty of water during the day and ensure you always have a full water bottle handy. It is better to take small sips often then drink large amounts all at once.
- Never leave pets or children in cars: Every year in Australia, 5000 kids are rescued from being left in hot cars. On a typical day the temperature inside a car can be 20 to 30 degrees hotter than outside. Health officials warn that children and pets left in a hot car for even one minute can prove fatal.
- Choose somewhere cool: Shopping centres, cinemas, libraries and community centres are all great places to flock when the weather is particularly hot as these places are air-conditioned.

It is important to stay out of the sun over the hottest part of the day and if you do need to be outside wear a hat and sun-cream and always have a bottle of water with you.

# Strathbogie Shire Council has applied for the first allocation of \$1 million of funding under the Federal Government's Drought Community Program support package.

If approved, part of the funding will be used to directly support farmers by bolstering infrastructure to improve public access to water.

This will be achieved by installing new bores, standpipes and water tanks at a number of locations throughout the Shire.


This project will not only assist drought-affected farmers but also enable the fast replenishment of water for fire-fighting appliances during emergency situations.

The Council was selected as one of 13 additional councils to be included in the Drought Communities Programme Extension in 2019.

The funding is part of a \$100 million national package rolled out late last year, which has a 30 June delivery timeline.

Strathbogie was deemed as a municipality at risk, with farmers and businesses across the community struggling with the ongoing dry conditions and low rainfall, which are slowing the local economy.

The funding is intended to stimulate economic activity and employment across drought-affected communities.







# **Strathbogie Shire Council has adopted its** first ever Arts and Culture Strategy at the **December 2019 Ordinary Council meeting.**

The strategy aims to increase opportunities for creative stimulation and connectedness, increase arts and cultural experiences, preserve heritage and foster diverse cultural sustainability within our Shire.

The need to further nurture, develop and support arts and culture within our community was highlighted at the beginning of Council's term as a part of the Conversation Cafes, which in turn led to the creation of the Tourism, Arts and Culture Advisory Group and the development of the 2019-2023 Arts and Culture Strategy.

Extensive consultation was conducted over a significant period of time, both within our community and amongst the broader creative collectives, in order to develop a strategy that is reflective of both our current and future needs, which also addresses the desired Cultural, Social, Environmental, Economic and Governance outcomes.

The associated 12-month action plan focuses on strategic objectives that have been identified as both important and achievable in line with the goals that were developed as reflective of both our immediate and broader community.
