Balmattum Hill Mountain Bike Trail a step closer

Strathbogie Shire Council has received state government funding to complete a feasibility study for a Mountain Bike Trail on Balmattum Hill at Euroa.

The project was one of 38 to recently receive funding from the Victorian Government's Regional Jobs and Infrastructure Fund (RJIF).

Strathbogie Shire Council Mayor Cr Laura Binks said the funding received would be used to carry out a feasibility study to determine all aspects of the potential trail.



The schedule and rotation of locations is currently being considered by Council staff," she said.

Council was successful in acquiring this infrastructure project funding though Creative Victoria under the Creative Neighbourhoods Infrastructure Program.

Pitch My Project returns for 2022/23



Strathbogie Shire Council's annual Pitch my Project initiative is now open for ideas to include in the 2023/24 Budget.

And, as part of our commitment to continually improving our engagement this year we'll put the final decision making into the hands of the community through a participatory budgeting exercise.


1. A shire-wide Playground Masterplan. incorporating detailed design of a nature play space at Seven Creeks, was funded in 2021/22.

3. A Longwood Master Plan received Pitch My Project 2021/22 funding We want our community to be involved in every step of the development of our 2023/24 Budget. This means we're making sure we fund the projects and initiatives that matter to our residents.

Council has \$300,000 for Pitch My Project as part of the 2023/24 annual budget. Each of the six Strategic Focus Areas within the Council Plan will receive \$50,000.

Since we launched the Pitch my Project initiative, we're proud to have funded more than 20 incredible ideas from our community.



We've also released guidelines which include a clear assessment process, and the successful applications will be put to the community to decide which make it into the 2023/24 Budget.

By putting the decision into the hands of our community we are showing our commitment to truly meaningful community involvement.

When it's time to vote we'll put all successful projects on our engagement platform www.share.strathbogie.vic.gov. au, but we'll also be hitting the streets to ensure everyone has the opportunity to have their say.



But first, it's time to pitch vour ideas. Head to www. share.strathbogie.vic.gov. **au** to read the guidelines and get pitching.

Help for flood-affected businesses and properties

The Victorian and Australian governments have announced funding support to flood affected people, families and businesses across Victoria - this includes Strathbogie Shire.

The Flood Recovery Hotline 1800 560 760 is a single, state-wide number that Victorians impacted by the October 2022 floods can call for help with:

Road Impacts

We are urging people to please take care driving on our rural roads which have been significantly impacted by flood.

Our team continues to respond as quickly as possible to ongoing matters arising from the floods however we know many many road surfaces have deteriorated to a point where some sections are difficult for drivers to navigate without significant reductions in speed. Please drive safely and to the conditions of the road.

Strathbogie Shire has more than 2210km of roads - 1465km unsealed and 748km sealed. On top of this there are 521 bridges and culverts to maintain.

We know poor road conditions are frustrating for our community and we are working as hard as we can, but there is no quick fix and we are not keeping up.

We are advocating to State and Federal governments for funding. Recently our Council moved a motion at the Municipal Association of Victoria's conference to lead a state-wide advocacy campaign calling on the Victorian Government to increase funding for road maintenance. Our motion was supported unanimously.



We ask our community to please be understanding. We may not get to your road tomorrow, next week or even next month. We are triaging our repairs to ensure our most used roads are repaired first. You can submit a road request through our online portal at www. strathbogie.vic.gov.au

New Australia-wide fire danger ratings in place

Catastrophic

For your survival, leave bush fire risk areas

As of 1 September 2022, Fire Danger Ratings have changed across Australia.

Each year, the CFA declares the Fire Danger Period for each municipality.

At the time of printing Strathbogie Shire is yet to enter this period. Updates on when the Fire Danger Period begins can be found on the CFA website.

Fire Danger Ratings are incredibly important to monitor during the Fire Danger Period. The ratings provide information so people in affected areas can take action to protect themselves and others. The higher the fire danger, the more dangerous the conditions and the greater the impact will be if a fire starts.

The new system uses better technology and research to determine fire danger ratings. It was developed using feedback from one of Australia's largest surveys of communities.

The new ratings are designed to be easier to understand and provide clear advice about actions to take.

There are now four Fire Danger Rating levels. When no Fire Danger Rating is issued, the arrow will point to a white 'no rating' level.

Old fire danger signs have been covered with stickers to let communities know fire danger ratings have changed. These old signs are being replaced with new ones, starting from September. The signs are being replaced according to the communities where fire season will arrive first. As the summer approaches, be sure to monitor conditions and check the VicEmergency website at www. emergency.vic.gov.au or app while at home and before travelling.

Victoria is one of the most fire-prone areas in the world. Bushfires and grassfires start quickly, often without warning and they can threaten lives and properties within minutes.

There's no questioning the facts. During a fire, embers can travel up to 40 kilometres ahead of the fire front and fire speeds can reach over 25 kilometres per hour.

Remember, on high-risk fire days, leaving early before a fire starts, is always the safest option.



Protect yourself against mozzies

The Victorian Government has announced that Japanese Encephalitis (JE) vaccine is recommended and available for specific priority groups, including people who may be exposed to the virus where they live or work.



Wodonga Council will be offering Japanese Encephalitis (JE) vaccination at special Japanese Encephalitis only vaccination sessions to priority groups.

The JE vaccination is now available free of charge to those in the priority groups. To book an appointment for JE vaccination, please phone Wodonga Council on 1800 655 360. JE vaccination is also available through certain pharmacies and GP's.
