Can a firm commitment of substantial further funding from the Shire be given now for Kirwans Bridge because it is such a critical piece of infrastructure and I believe the Shire has a very clear legislated obligation to this heritage structure. n response, Council is very aware of the importance of Kirwans Bridge to this community and the broader community.

We understand the impact of the bridge's closure on the Kirwans Bridge community. In terms of considering the allocation of funding, Council will be considering this matter at tonight's meeting.

Furthermore, Council has indicated that it values the bridge through the establishment on the Community Panel to identify the long-term options for this bridge. We also allocated funding to secure the services of JJ Ryan to undertake the scoping works for the two options of the bridge, namely:

• A new replica bridge (with pedestrian and cycling access), or

• Extensive structural repairs and strengthening works to the existing bridge. The work on the design and costing of these options is underway. Once this report has been received, Council will understand the quantum of funding required for the bridge.

5.3.1 <u>Contract Variation – Contract No. 22-23-01: Weir Road and Reedy Lake Road</u> <u>Upgrade – Nagambie</u>

EXECUTIVE SUMMARY

Weir Road and Reedy Lake Road Upgrade – Nagambie project formed part of Council's 2022/23 Capital Works Program.

At the August 2022 Council Meeting, Council resolved to award Contract No 22/23-01 for Weir Road and Reedy Lake Road Upgrade – Nagambie to Seven Creeks Excavations Pty Ltd, after emerging as the successful tenderer following a competitive tender process. The lumpsum contract was awarded to the contractor for a total sum of \$738,070.

The project was scheduled to commence in October 2022; however, was delayed due to the incessant rains and following major flood event which resulted in the isolation of the Kirwan's Bridge community.

After informal discussions with Council, Officers took the opportunity to learn from this flood event and review the design of Weir Road and Reedy Lake Road to try and minimise the possibility of this road being impassable in any future flood. After further consultation, a revised design was completed with a recommendation to alter the pavement layers to lift sections of the road.

After negotiations with the existing Contractor, the altered design specifications would require the approval of a revised contract price (after negotiation) of \$1,822,870.08 (inclusive of GST) representing a \$1,084,800.08 or 147% increase to the original contract amount.

There are four courses of action that Council could take at this juncture:

- Option 1 deliver the project as originally scoped using the existing contract, with construction commencing in April 2023 and continuing during winter where there are heightened risks of short and long term pavement failure due to inclement weather/cool conditions
- Option 2 increase the design specifications to raise the road pavement height to above flood level and approve an exception to our Procurement Policy to vary the existing contract by more than 20%, with works commencing in April 2023 and continuing during winter where there are heightened risks of short and long term pavement failure due to inclement weather/cool conditions
- Option 3 increase the design specifications to raise the road pavement height to above flood level and approve an exception to our Procurement Policy to vary the existing contract by more than 20%, with works commencing in September 2023 when weather conditions are more conducive to road construction

5.3.1 <u>Contract Variation – Contract No. 22-23-01: Weir Road and Reedy Lake Road</u> <u>Upgrade – Nagambie (cont.)</u>

 Option 4 – cancel the existing contract, pay compensation to the existing contractor (which may be the full contract price) and retender the project at the new specification levels, with construction commencing in late 2023.

Each of these four options have pros and cons; some with significant potential adverse impacts on Council and the community.

With the window for ideal weather for road building being over by the end of March, it is recommended to commence the works in September 2023 and be completed by December 2023. Delaying the commencement of works will overcome any further need for cost variations due to damage to works caused by inclement weather.

On balance, it is recommended that Option 3 – approving an exception to the Procurement Policy and approving a variation to the contract to allow for the improved design specification but delaying commencement to the project until September 2023 is considered the best course of action.

However, there is strong community sentiment and expectation that the road is sealed prior to the winter months. A meeting of the Kirwans Bridge Community Panel was held on 28 March 2023, during which feedback on the timing of this project was discussed, along with options for additional grading and watering of the road should the project be deferred until Spring.

Should Council decide to defer construction until September 2023, Council's Operations team will continue to monitor the condition of Weir Road and allocate resources to grading the road once a fortnight if required. The regularity of grading will be informed by regular inspections by Operations staff and will be dependent on weather conditions over the winter period.

There are two options to enable regular grading to occur; Option 1 is to take a grader out of rotation and allocate it solely to Weir Road, which would cost around \$2,830. Option 2 is to hire an additional grader to allocate to Weir Road at a cost of \$105,709 incl GST for a five (5) month period. It is considered that there would be an adverse impact on other communities given that taking an existing grader out of rotation would delay the scheduled grading program across the broader locality, therefore Option 2 is recommended as the preferred course of action. This additional budget allocation needs to be made as part of the additional funding package for this project.

It is recognised that this is a difficult decision to make given the complexity of issues and competing interests, however it is considered that taking a longer term, sustainable view of the project will result in reduced interruptions and safety impacts for the community, along with better long term value for money outcomes for Council. 5.3.1 <u>Contract Variation – Contract No. 22-23-01: Weir Road and Reedy Lake Road</u> <u>Upgrade – Nagambie (cont.)</u>

- 3. Approve the carry forward of the budget allocated to this project in the 2022-23 financial year to the 2023-24 financial year, while providing an additional budget allocation within the 2023-24 capital works program to cover this variation; and
- 4. Allocate \$820,000 for the future repairs and maintenance of Kirwans Bridge in the draft capital works budget for 2023-24.
