Fire ready for summer

he Fire Danger Period for our Shire began on November 27, 2023 as declared by the CFA.

Council has contacted community members with properties requiring firereduction work in the Shire and provided information on how this can be achieved. If residents or property owners have questions about what they need to do, they can call Council on 1800 065 993.

Preparing for a bush fire is easier than you think. By taking 20 minutes with your family to discuss what you'll do during a fire you could save their lives as well as your home.

CFA are encouraging the following actions to prepare yourself and your property:

- 1. Move your winter woodpile away from the house or sheds.
- 2. Prune tree branches so they are not overhanging the roof or touching walls.
- 3. Clear your gutters.

LOCAL EMERGENCY ACTION PLANS

trathbogie Shire Council has joined forces with Mansfield and Murrindindi Shire Councils to deliver the LEAPing into Resilience Project, funded by the Federal Government.

The project will result in five Strathbogie Shire townships being equipped with their own community driven Local Emergency Action Plans (LEAPs).

Already, the Violet Town LEAP Steering Group have completed their plan with the community now more prepared for local emergencies.

The Violet Town Local Emergency Action Plan (LEAP) was the first LEAP to be released following a collaborative process with the steering group consisting of local community residents and various emergency agencies (CFA, VicSES, Ambulance Victoria and Victoria Police) along with Council's support.

LEAPs are also currently being developed for Avenel, Euroa and Strathbogie while Nagambie's will take place in 2024.

The LEAPing into Resilience project enables people to become more aware of the risks facing their community and identify ways they can be better prepared for emergencies and able to respond and recover from these events.

onstruction on the Nagambie Foreshore Walk was recently completed, bringing the \$3.8 million project to fruition.

The fully accessible pathway stretches for 1.6km along the southern edge of Lake Nagambie and is 2.5m wide to allow pedestrians and cyclists to share the walkway and ensure it is enjoyed by all.

The infrastructure for the new Nagambie Foreshore Walk is a significant addition to appreciate all our Shire has to offer.

It offers a safe and accessible connection between Nagambie Lakes Regatta Centre, the Nagambie Lakes Leisure Park and the town centre, supporting township connectivity, economic development and safe, healthy, active living.

The project is a true testament to what can be achieved when all tiers of government come together. The project was made possible by a \$3 million Victorian Government Regional Development Victoria Grant, with additional contributions from the Federal Government and Strathbogie Shire Council.

The Jubilee Park Play Space upgrade was assisted with the help of local residents, in particular school and kindergarten students, who helped to select the equipment for the upgrade.

Residents were given the choice from three proposed suitable locations and feedback strongly indicated the desire for the stations to go in the median strip carpark in Nagambie's main street.

Council has already seen usage data dramatically increase since the stations went live.

teady progress is being made to repair Strathbogie Shire Council's igcup community facilities following the devastating floods in October 2022.

Overview of the progress on Council's community facilities repairs as of beginning of December 2023:

RSL Club: 25 per cent complete. The discovery of termite damage was promptly addressed to prevent further delays in the restoration process.

Euroa Bowls Club: Progress 50 per cent, with works initiated in early July. Plastering and flooring have been successfully completed.

Euroa Croquet Club: At 70 per cent completion, most of the carpentry and plastering work is done. About 40 per cent of the electrical and plumbing work has been completed, with painting underway. Upcoming tasks include installing new windows and an entry door, along with completing the flooring.

Euroa Third Age Club: Progress currently stands at 20 per cent, with the focus starting on the flooring, which recently commenced.

Euroa Miniature Railway: The facility has been stripped out and is on track for restoration works to commence in January.

Euroa Caravan Park: This area is still under investigation as we work diligently to assess the extent of the damage and develop a comprehensive plan for recovery.

Council are extremely grateful to our community for their understanding throughout this process and we will provide an update when the works are complete.





ROAD REPAIRS POST FLOODS

ngoing repairs are being made to Council-managed roads following destructive floods in October 2022.

Council would like to once again thank the community for their patience as we work diligently to repair our roads.

We have initiated repair works focusing on sections of roads that suffered floodrelated damage. These efforts are vital to ensure the safety and convenience of local residents, businesses, and commuters.

While several sections of roads have already undergone restoration, the recovery efforts have faced unexpected delays due to adverse weather conditions, with many roads still awaiting repair.

Seal works on Polly McQuinns Road have been successfully completed, representing a significant milestone in the ongoing recovery process. Outstanding road repair projects awaiting completion, including: Monea, Tarcombe, Ponkeen Creek, Youngs, Wahring-Euroa and Cahill roads. We anticipate these repairs will be completed prior to the end of the year.

Major full reconstruction works are also on the horizon for some roads. For instance, the landslip on Harry's Creek Road is currently under traffic management controls, and reconstruction works are anticipated to start in 2024.

Safety remains a top priority, and we are working diligently to minimise disruptions and inconveniences while ensuring the roads are restored to a high standard.

We will continue to be in close communication with affected residents and stakeholders to provide updates on the progress and necessary traffic management measures during these road repairs. We are grateful for the community's support and cooperation during this challenging period.

ouncil has partnered with UpCycle4Better (U4B) to provide the Strathbogie community with an opportunity to dispose of textile items for upcycling free of charge.

Residents can drop of items such as clothing, shoes, home textiles, soft toys, accessories and underwear.

Australians buy about 27kg of fashion and textiles per year, of which we dispose of 93 per cent. Australia has 1,168 operational landfills that receive more than 20 million tonnes of textile waste each year.

We encourage the community to be conscious when buying new clothes as well as donating your pre-loved items that are still in good condition to your local opportunity shop and second-hand stores to ensure we can divert as much waste from landfill as possible.

The team at U4B reuse items that are in good condition and require little or no resources to keep the items in use. But when items require repair, U4B will work to give a fresh look to items, so they can head back into local shops as a resource for the community.

Lastly, U4B recycles what cannot be upcycled by breaking down the items into products such as rags, ensuring nothing is wasted and ends up in landfill.

These Textile Recovery Boxes are located at the Euroa, Nagambie, Violet Town and Avenel transfer stations.

CONTAINER DEPOSIT SCHEME


n 1 November 2023 the Victorian Government's container deposit scheme, CDS Vic, commenced.

The scheme rewards Victorians with a 10-cent refund for every eligible can, carton and bottle they return.

There are currently two over the counter collection points in Strathbogie Shire:

The Avenel Café, 28 Livingstone Street, Avenel
