For the period ending 10 April 2026

## Regulations:

- All cats and dogs 3 months of age or older must be registered
- A child's cat or dog must be registered in the parent or guardian's name
- If you do not register your pet, you are breaking the law and may be liable for a fine
- Your pet must have a microchip implanted by your vet before it can be registered with us

**Reduced Fees** apply for pets that fit under one of the following categories: **Desexed cat or dog**

- **Cat or dog more than 10 years old**
- **Cat or dog kept for breeding by the proprietor of a registered Domestic Animal Business**
- **Cat owner is a member of one of the following:**
  - Australian National Cats Inc.
  - Cats Victoria Inc.
  - Feline Control Council (Victoria) Inc.
  - The Governing Council of the Cat Fancy Australia & Victoria Inc.
- **Dog has completed obedience training with one of the following:**
  - Australian Association of Professional Dog Trainers Inc.
  - The Gentle Dog Trainers Association Inc
  - Dogs Victoria
  - Four Paws K9 Training
  - Delta Institute
  - The Kintala Dog Club Association Inc.
- **Dog owner is a member of one of the following:**
  - Dogs Victoria (Vic Canine Association)
  - Greyhound Racing Victoria
- **Dog is kept for working stock** - to be classified as a working dog under the *Domestic Animal Act 1994*, they need to meet the following criteria:
  - Working dogs must be primarily used for herding, droving, protecting or working stock on land used solely or primarily for primary production.
  - To be eligible you must be engaged in primary production as your primary source of income.
  - If the owner of a working dog resides in a residential area they must show proof of their occupation.

**It is an offence to knowingly register a non-farm working dog as a farm working dog.**

- **Dog is kept as an Assistance Dog** – to be eligible for registration fee exemption, the assistance dog must meet the *Equal Opportunity Act 2010* definition, being “a dog that is trained to perform tasks or functions that assist a person with a disability to alleviate the effects of his or her disability”.

The owner of an assistance dog must provide reasonable evidence that:

- the applicant has a disability as defined under the *Commonwealth Disability Discrimination Act 1992*
- the assistance dog has been trained to perform tasks or functions that assist to alleviate the effect(s) of that disability
- the assistance dog has completed obedience training by a dog trainer
- the assistance dog is desexed
- the assistance dog is microchipped
- the assistance dog is at least 12 months of age

**Note:** The obedience training can either be completed separately, or as part of the training undertaken to perform tasks or functions that assist the person with a disability to alleviate the effects of their disability.

- Evidence of a disability (as defined under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992*) necessitating you to be accompanied by your assistance dog may include a:
  - declaration from a health professional as part of a registration application form, or
  - a written recommendation from and/or a declaration by the relevant treating medical practitioner to verify that the owner has a disability and will require the assistance of an assistance dog.

Under the *Disability Discrimination Act 1992* a person may request that a person with a disability produce evidence that an animal is an assistance animal, distinguished by being trained to alleviate the effect of a disability.

The requirement to provide this evidence ensures that only dogs that fit the definition of assistance dog receive free registration.
